Response:

Prevention: Keep away from heat, sparks, open flames, hot surfaces - no smoking. Keep container tightly

4. FIRST AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Move to fresh air. If not breathing, give artificial respiration. Get immediate

5. FIRE FIGHTING MEASURES
